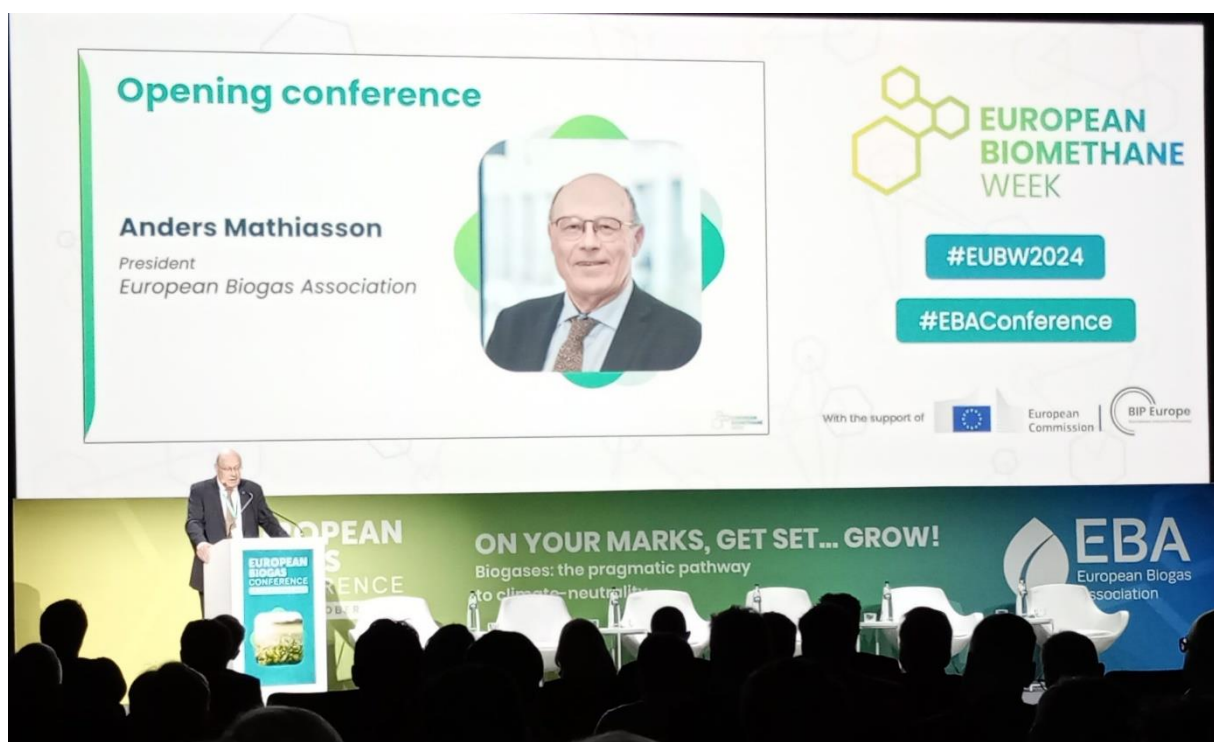




The European Biogas Conference

The European Biogas Conference is the flagship event during the European Biomethane Week organised by the European Biogas Association (EBA). More than 700 delegates participated when the 2024 edition took place 23-24 October at the EGG in Brussels.

Anders Mathiasson talked about the vast potential for continuous growth of the biomethane sector, and the need to ensure that policymakers truly understand the importance and the role of renewable methane in Europe's energy transition.

Not everything can be electrified

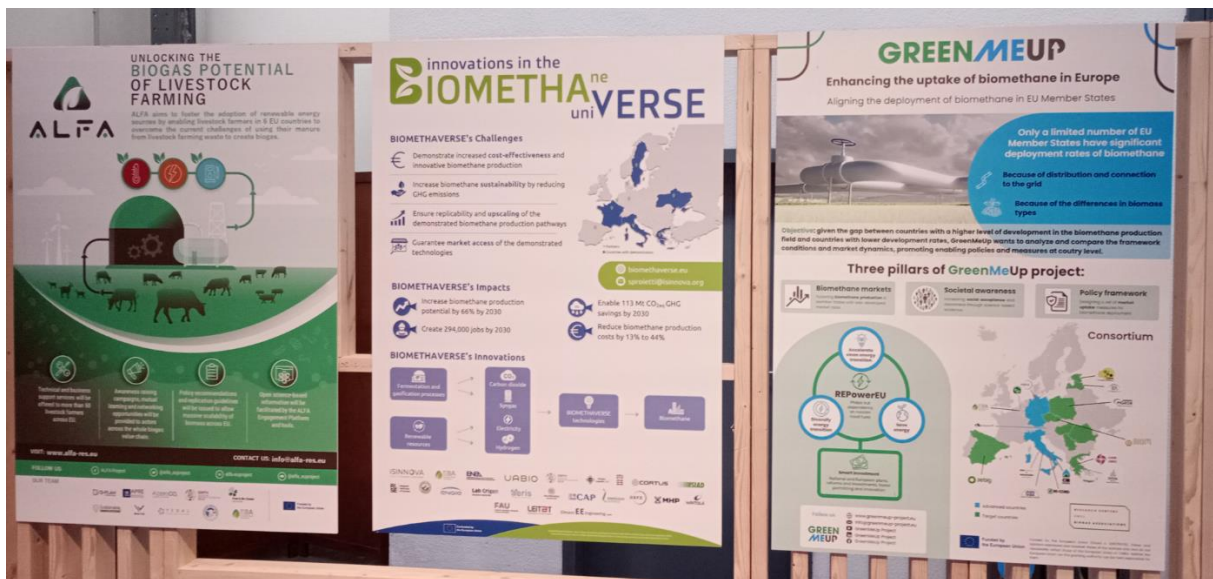
Paolo Frankl from the International Energy Agency pointed out that in the most optimistic scenarios for 2050, the electrification will at most cover 55% of the world's energy demand. The rest must be covered by molecules, and here renewable methane has an important role to play.

Rapid growth

The number of plants in Europe where biogas is upgraded to biomethane is growing rapidly. Xavier Passemard from Gaz Réseau Distribution France (GRDF) pointed out that there are more than 600 such facilities only in France and many more in the planning stage.
